Insights

- Since our opening four years ago, St. Joseph High School has seen continuous and ongoing improvement across all areas of measure. This year we saw improvement in 9 of 11 and maintained in 2 of 11 measures.
- We are especially proud of our Safe and Caring measure of 92.69%. An underlying theme at St. Joseph High School is to create a safe, caring and welcoming environment. This has been accomplished with dedicated staff and students who actively contribute to this ideal.
- While not reported on our report card, St. Joseph High School has also seen significant gains in student Diploma Results. Staff have worked hard at focusing on the learner, reteaching concepts that students struggle with and challenging them where appropriate. Strong Diploma results do have an impact on post-secondary acceptance and we are pleased our students are performing well.

Future Priorities



Students have returned after a six month absence from school routines and expectations, resulting in a discontinuity in their learning. Teachers are responding to students' current knowledge by creating plans to ensure success on their current high leverage outcomes.



Leading teacher learning and development continues to be a significant factor within our instructional leadership journey. Subject team and administrator collaboration will continue to be a focus for school-based professional development. Two areas of focus for this time are maintaining the high-leverage teaching and assessment practices implemented last year and continuing to explore additional high-leverage learning outcomes to further meet the diverse needs of our learners.



September has brought students back to school and ready to learn. COVID-19 has resulted in many students reporting higher than normal levels of anxiety. For students to be successful in their learning, students need to be mentally prepared to engage. As teachers and support staff are on the front lines and often the first point of contact, teachers need to be equipped and well to support students. To achieve this, the focus this year will be on supporting staff to help students with strategies to reduce anxiety.
